Artistic (Creator) - occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs and patterns. They often require self-expression and the work can be done without following a clear set of rules.



Enterprising (Persuader) – occupations frequently involve starting up and carrying out projects. These occupations can involve leading people and making many decisions. Sometimes they require risk taking and often deal with business.

Expertise

- Active Listening giving full attention to what other people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as appropriate, and not interrupting at inappropriate times.
- Judgment and Decision Making considering the relative costs and benefits of potential actions to choose the most appropriate one.
- Operations Analysis analyzing needs and product requirements to create a design.

Day-to-Day Tasks

- Select or design, and purchase furnishings, art works, and accessories.
- Advise client on interior design factors such as space planning, layout and use of furnishings or equipment, and color coordination.
- Coordinate with other professionals, such as contractors, architects, engineers, and plumbers, to ensure job success.

Work Setting

- E-mail is an integral part of the job.
- There are a lot of face-to-face discussions with individuals or teams.
- Phone calls are as important as face-toface discussion.
- It requires working indoors in environmentally controlled conditions.

Knowledge

• **Design** — Knowledge of design techniques, tools, and principles involved in production of precision technical plans, blueprints, drawings, and models.

• Building and Construction – knowledge of materials, methods, and the tools involved in the construction or repair of houses, buildings, or other structures such as highways and roads.

• Customer and Personal Service – knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer and personal services. This includes customer needs assessment, meeting quality standards for services, and evaluation of customer satisfaction.
